Los Angeles born Angela Park received her bachelor degree from the Curtis Institute of Music studying with Orlando Cole and Peter Wiley. She received her Master of Music from the New England Conservatory studying with Laurence Lesser. In 2009-2010, she returns to NEC to resume studies with Laurence Lesser in the Graduate Diploma program.

While at Curtis Institute, Ms. Park performed in the Symphony Orchestra (second chair) and the Chamber Orchestra (principal). Her coaches included Steven Tenenbom, Pamela Frank, Meng-chieh Liu, Ida Kavafian, Peter Wiley, and Joseph Silverstein. While there, she performed with musicians such as Daniel Matsukawa, Leonidas Kavakos, Gary Graffman, Roberto Diaz, and David Kim. Ms. Park was under the baton of various conductors including Sir Simon Rattle, Christoph Eschenbach, Robert Spano, Charles Dutoit, and Michael Tilson Thomas.

While at NEC, Ms. Park performed in the Chamber Orchestra and Philharmonia Orchestra. She has soloed with the Chamber Orchestra, participated in the Beethoven and Bartok Quartet Seminars, and performed in recital with Laurence Lesser.

Ms. Park has participated in the Kronberg Cello Academy with Frans Helmerson, Gary Hoffman, and Ralph Kirshbaum, and Lincoln Center's Masterclasses with Colin Carr. She has taken additional masterclasses with Natalia Gutman, Timothy Eddy, and Paul Katz. Summer programs have included the Perlman Music Program, Perlman Chamber Music Workshop, Piatigorsky Seminar at USC, Ravinia's Steans Institute, Music from Angel Fire, and the Verbier Festival Academy.

Ms. Park has performed with the Philadelphia Orchestra, KBS (Korean Broadcasting System) Orchestra, Seoul Philharmonic Orchestra, Seoul Symphony Orchestra, and the Xiamen (China) Philharmonic Orchestra, among others, and has given recitals in the United States, Asia, and Europe. Her concerts have been broadcast on radio and television in Philadelphia and Seoul.
