NMW can be traced back to 1915, when a visionary named Charles M. Tremaine started promoting the idea of setting aside one week each year to celebrate music in the community. Mr. Tremaine saw the need of music as "food for the soul." The concept of NMW was first observed in 1917 in Boise, Idaho. It began to grow until 1924 marked the inauguration of the first National Music Week throughout America. In its inaugural year, there were 452 celebrations throughout our country.

Since 1959 the National Federation of Music Clubs has been the sole administrator of NMW. As an organization, let's promote National Music Week in our communities. Think of new and imaginative ways to celebrate NMW in your towns and cities using music, art, drama, dance, poetry and essay.

Schedule events in schools, community centers, nursing homes, retirement homes, veteran homes, malls, parks and other public places.

National Music Week

National Music Week, celebrated during the first full week in May, focuses attention on music as a powerful tool for communication and personal expression as well as a universal tool for peace, understanding and harmony. Everyone is encouraged to sponsor musical events and celebrate music during National Music Week. NFMC membership is not required for participation.

***Note:** Local groups should express appreciation to the mayor and to the governor for proclamations as NFMC awards are not presented to them.*

National Music Week Celebration Ideas

BUSINESSES, BANKS, MALLS

- Noon concerts
- Special Music Week displays
- Use NMW in advertising

SCHOOLS

- Choral, band, orchestra concerts in schools, malls
- Special music during lunch or announcements
- Essay Contest participation. Print/read essays
- Poster displays/contests

PUBLIC LIBRARIES

- Feature "NMW Book Shelf"
- Schedule concerts during the week
- Displays of instruments, musical scores, photos of musicians, etc.

SERVICE CLUBS

- Use music in meetings during the week
- Speaker: "Value of Music in the Community"
- Give music scholarship to a student

CHURCHES

- Recognize NMW in bulletin
- Sponsor choir festivals, concerts, etc.
- Programs for hospitals, nursing homes, etc.

MUSIC CLUBS

- Use "Together We Sing" – American music
- Obtain supplies for early distribution via website or headquarters
- Request NMW Proclamation from mayor
- Programs for clubs, malls, nursing homes, etc.
- Provide NMW themes and dates for Arts Council and Chamber of Commerce calendars
- Place NMW info in symphony programs
- Invite symphony participation
- Encourage Junior Clubs to participate



Guidelines for NMW Awards

- All programs must occur within the specified dates of NMW.
- Submit publicity (i.e. programs, photos) for each event.
 - ✓ The **National Federation of Music Clubs** and **National Music Week** must be printed in the program.
 - ✓ **Newspapers:** Each article must include the National Federation of Music Clubs and National Music Week with each submitted reference underlined in red. Include date, name of newspaper, city and state with each article.
 - ✓ **Media:** Awards based on half- hour or more feature programs. Scripts (AR 12-9) are available.
 - ✓ **Displays:** Awards are based on individual quality. Submit pictures if possible.
 - ✓ **Websites:** Verify website activity.
- Send report and Entry Form (AR 12-1) with all NMW articles, photos and NMW event verification to appropriate state chair. A list of state chairs is included.

Postmark deadline: June 1.

Guidelines for State Chairs

Compile all submitted information on Form AR 12-5. Make award recommendations based on quality and quantity of participation. List plainly written or type the complete names of groups, businesses, performers and others eligible for NMW Awards. Mail completed final report to the appropriate regional chair. Do not forward accompanying materials. (List of regional chairs is included.)

Postmark deadline: June 10.

Guidelines for Regional Chairs

Compile an alphabetical list of states and clubs after receiving forms from state chairs. Print or type plainly all groups, businesses, performers and others recommended for NMW Awards. Mail or email completed Report Form AR 12-6 to the national chair and to NFMC headquarters.

Postmark deadline: June 30.

National Music Week History

Following sporadic observances of musical presentations, Charles M. Tremaine was the catalyst for an official National Music Week, and the first National Music Week was observed in 1924 in 452 cities and towns. Otto Kahn, Metropolitan Opera board chair, served as NMW chair, and NFMC President Mrs. John F. Lyons served on the first NMW committee. President Calvin Coolidge served as the first Honorary Chair. Additional NMW historical information can be found in the book "National Music Week" by Charles M. Tremaine.

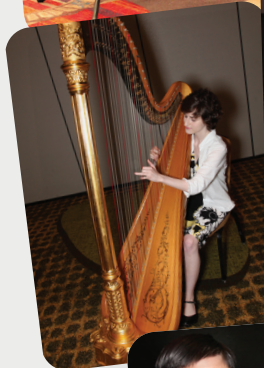
